

Learning Disabilities Specialist

Heathwood Hall Episcopal School in Columbia SC has an immediate need for a part time Learning Disabilities Specialist within our Elementary Transition Program, a resource program for children with learning disabilities. The special education teacher will be responsible for the planning and implementation of all educational goals and objectives of assigned children as well as for overall classroom management and safety.

The Learning Disabilities Specialist will formulate and implement the Learning Plans for each child by planning and providing instruction on developmentally appropriate activities. S/he will be expected to serve as a member of an interdisciplinary team that ensures the welfare of children and attends meetings, as directed, and maintains accurate and up-to-date records concerning each child in the classroom.

The successful candidate will be able to communicate effectively and positively with the parents/guardians of assigned children and work collaboratively with other teachers. S/he will successfully implement multi-sensory teaching methodologies with small groups of children in grades 1 – 4. The Learning Disabilities Specialist should be skilled in evaluation and assessment of students' needs and possess strong teaching, planning, and problem-solving skills along with solid written and verbal communication skills. The successful candidate will be eager to seek professional growth by maintaining current knowledge and skills pertinent to the position. S/he will have a demonstrated creative ability and possess a supportive, positive, and patient attitude towards children.

Requirements

Qualifications for the position include: Minimum of a Master's degree in Special Education. Training in Orton-Gillingham based reading instruction desired.
