

Visual Art Concentration (VAC) at Heathwood Hall

Heathwood Hall is excited to offer a diploma distinction: Visual Art Concentration. The Visual Art Concentration continues Heathwood Hall's long tradition of knowing each student and encouraging and recognizing the dedicated pursuit of excellence in each student's areas of interest and passion. VAC students fulfill all of Heathwood Hall's normal graduation requirements, but with increased Visual Art requirements and dedicated art-making time outside of class.

The Student:

This Concentration is for a student seeking an intensive, individualized, art-focused study. Students may apply, with their parents' support, to enter the Visual Art Concentration during their Freshman, Sophomore, or very early Junior Year. VAC Students enroll in classes that are already being offered to Heathwood Hall students, experiencing the same Heathwood Hall environment, community, and broad course offerings, but with an Art weighted curriculum requirement. This student would also have outside-of-class-time studio requirements, as well as art specific Winterim and Senior Exhibition requirements.

Visual Art Concentration - Requirement Details

- Visual Art Concentration students must complete Drawing, plus three other directed Visual Art Classes (Painting, Environmental Art, Ceramics, Photography, Graphic Arts, Video Editing, or other directed Special Topics Art Courses). (Min. of 2 credits)
- Visual Art Concentration students must be enrolled in Studio Art (self-directed) for Junior and Senior Years. (2 total credits of Studio Art)
- Visual Art Concentration students must complete one semester of Art History. (1/2 credit)
- Visual Art Concentration students must catalogue 120 hours of studio time outside of class each year of 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. At least 60 hours per year must be worked on campus. Up to 60 hours each year may be worked off campus. 120 hours is approximately 4 hours per full week of regular classes (not counting half-weeks or finals weeks). For example, a student could fulfill their required hours by working a total of 2 hours in the art classroom before and/or after school and 2 hours at home each week.
- The student's one required Winterim Internship must be served as an apprentice to an artist working in a relevant medium.
- Visual Art Concentration students are required to choose an art-themed topic for either the Research Paper (Option A) or the Product and Paper (Option B) of the Senior Exhibition requirement.
- Visual Art Concentration students will mount a more ambitious Art Exhibit than the standard Studio Art requirement for Spring Semester of their Senior Year.
- Students may apply for admittance to the Visual Art Concentration during 9th or 10th grade year. Students beginning their 11th grade year may be considered if previous course work allows for the fulfillment of the Concentration requirements. Later entries may lead to heavier course loads or summer classes to fulfill the requirements. Required studio time hours begin at point of entry. Interested students will be interviewed by Visual Art faculty, including an examination of previous artworks, to determine acceptance into the Visual Art Concentration.
- The status of students in the Visual Art Concentration will be evaluated in a formal review at the end of each semester. If a student is not performing at an acceptable level or not satisfying basic requirements, a probationary period with set expectations will be established. If a student must exit the program for any reason, they would simply revert back to the normal Heathwood Hall graduation requirements.
